# GENERAL POLICIES

VERSION 1.0 - EFFECTIVE DATE: 13 NOVEMBER 2025

### INTRODUCTION STATEMENT

First and foremost, the WTC is a gathering of like-minded individuals and peers that come together with the aim to spend a great moment together. As such the WTC should be a safe and enjoyable environment for all the attendees as well as any staffing personnel, exhibitors, or otherwise. With the general rules and guidelines outlined below, we hope to have answered any questions you may have had. Anyone found to be in breach of the policies outlined below may be subject to immediate removal from the venue without rights to any refund, and be brought before the local authorities for further adjudication. Attendees is a colloquial term and indicates everyone who is present at the event but not part of the organisational crew (such as visitors or ticket holders).

### GENERAL CONDUCT STIPULATIONS

1. Attendees agree to comply with all the Event Organizer's applicable rules, policies, terms, and conditions. A ticket is a revocable license and admission may be refused. Breach of Event Organizer Rules will terminate your license to attend the event without refund. The Event Organizer has the right to refuse admission to or eject—without refund of any amount paid—any person whose conduct management deems unsafe, disorderly, vulgar, or abusive, or who otherwise fails to comply with Event Organizer Rules. As such attendees must follow all WTC policies, on-site staff directions and venue-associated rules.
2. Attendees are responsible for their own belongings. The organisation is not liable for personal property left unattended. If you see or encounter property that seems lost or abandoned, please bring said item(s) to the registration or referee desks, or approach any of the on-site staffing personnel.
3. We expect our attendees to use common sense in regards to behavior, and always be respectful in how they personally interact with other attendees, staffing personnel, exhibitors or otherwise. We adhere to the core principle that everyone should contribute to creating a safe environment for everyone else. Any attendee must refrain from deliberate acts that may cause harm to others or create unhealthy situations or danger. E.g. this includes, but is not limited to, the excessive consumption of alcoholic beverages, bullying or harassment, assault, disregarding the safety of one or more individuals, ... If you experience, whether first-hand or not, that anyone is exhibiting behavior that is not in scope of expectations, please report it as soon as possible to any WTC personnel on site.

### PROHIBITED ACTIONS, ITEMS AND MATERIALS

1. Do not consume any alcohol if you are below the age of 16.
2. Do not smoke or vape inside the venue.
3. You are subject to search. You and your belongings may be searched on entry to the event. You consent to such searches and waive any related claims that may arise. If you elect not to consent to such searches, you may be denied entry to the event without refund or other compensation. Under certain event organizer rules, certain items may not be brought into the premises, including without limitation: firearms, alcohol, drugs, controlled substances, cameras, drones, recording devices, laser pointers, strobe lights, irritants (e.g., artificial noisemakers), and containers. This includes self-defense, recreational and utility items such as knives, tasers,

pepper spray, ... etc. Even if it is lawful to own and carry them in the public domain, they are not welcome at the WTC as part of our risk management procedures.

3. Do not bring any drones or recording devices into the venue without prior approval and consent. There are local regulations to adhere to with legal implications. Anyone bringing in items like these will be liable for any damages and fines that result from the improper use there-of.

4. Do not bring pets on site unless they are certified service animals.

5. Theft of organizational, venue-related or personal property will result in an immediate expulsion from the event, an automatic report to the local police, and comes with a lifelong ban from being able to attend any of our events in the future.

### VENUE ACCESS & SPACE MANAGEMENT

1. The event hall is not open 24/7. WTC staff will open and close up the venue at appropriate times. Attendees are expected to respect timelines as indicated by WTC staff. These timelines can be consulted via our website or via our relevant event packs.

2. Attendees can leave their miniatures at the venue overnight, but at own risk. While there may be third party permanence at the venue, the organisation is not liable for any loss of property that was left unattended.

3. Any items that are found unattended must be brought to the "Lost & Found" area at the referee station inside the venue.

4. Attendees are expected to make sure their gaming area for a given round is tidy after a given round and that no trash or bottles are left on and under tables. Repeat offenders leaving their area untidy may be penalised at the discretion of our adjudicating staff.

5. Belgium has a strict separation of waste regulation. As such we will provide bins all over the venue for attendees to help us manage the correct trash disposal and mitigate any potential fines. Cardboard and paper can be left beside the bins on the floor as they are a separate waste stream, just like glass bottles for which we will put dedicated crates next to the bins. Blue bins are for plastics and drinking materials like cans. The black bins are for general waste that does not belong to any of the above categories.

### LIABILITY AND CLAUSES

1. The WTC is open to the public insofar that it allows people that haven't purchased a ticket to participate in any of the organised events to still attend on site. Everyone that is on-site, whether they have purchased a ticket or not, must adhere to all policies and will be considered attendees/ticket holders for all intents and purposes.

2. Attendees release WTC from any liability for loss or damage to persons or property. Ticket holders/attendees voluntarily assume all risks incidental to the event for which the ticket is issued, whether occurring before, during, or after the event.

3. WTC events are public and you may be recorded or photographed. You agree that the event for which you purchase tickets is a public event, that your appearance and actions inside and outside the venue where the event occurs are public in nature, and that you have no expectation of privacy with regard to your actions or conduct at the event. You grant permission to us, the Event Organizer(s), and our partners, licensees, and assigns (including but not limited to our brand and media partners) to use your name, image, likeness, acts, poses, plays, appearance, movements, and statements in any live or recorded audio, video, or photographic display or other transmission, exhibition, publication, or reproduction made of, or at, the event (regardless of whether before,

during, or after play or performance) for any purpose, in any manner (whether edited, cropped, altered, or combined with other elements or effects), in any medium or context now known or hereafter developed, including marketing materials, without further authorization from, or compensation to, you or anyone acting on your behalf. You agree that you will not have any claim, including claims based upon invasion of privacy, defamation, or right of publicity, arising out of any use in accordance with the terms of this paragraph.

4. Attendees agree to comply with all the rules and regulations of the event.
5. The WTC reserves the right to deny entry or remove from the venue any person who is behaving, or threatens to behave, in a manner which is considered disruptive or in violation of the outlined policies, and this without the opportunity to request for a refund.
